
Onerahi **Primary School Drains to** Harbour Waimahanga **Stream Discovery!**

Wow only 14 degrees here..that's a lot cooler than the wetland ...must be all these big tall trees and fast flowing water...that's really good for the bugs and fish!



























We found bugs under rocks like this one here...






An Isopod
